4. OPEN FORUM - points raised:-

 PC Casson reported a busy month dealing with thefts, disorderly youths and a suspicious character on Tarn Lane. A visit was also reported to advise the farmer in Docker Lane how to deal with motor rallies using the lane.

K.Hayhurst reported the recovery of an historic milepost and requested the Council help in reinstating it within the Parish as well as restoring two other existing original mileposts. The recovered milepost was passed to the Chairman for safekeeping and Councillors agreed this should be on the agenda for the next Council meeting. Thanks were expressed to Hedley & Michael Stephenson for their work in restoring the milepost between the Parish Boundary and the football field on the A6070. (CD)

9. AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The Chairman circulated a plan of the proposal prepared by the Impact Housing Association, showing a mixed development of 12 dwellings on part of the Boon Town playing fields, and invited the presence of another Cllr. to join with the Chairman and the Clerk at a meeting at 2pm on 20 December, 2004 between SLDC, Impact and the Council to discuss the proposals further. After a discussion the Councillors, with the exception of one Councillor who expressed opposition to the size of the development, agreed that subject to a Village Meeting the siting of the development was acceptable, on condition that new playground equipment was provided, maintained and insured by SLDC and that the number of dwellings be reduced. Cllr. Mason-Hornby declared a personal interest. The Chairman announced that there was another site meeting scheduled for 20 December, 2004 at 9.30am to agree the remedial works required before the official handover of the Quarry to the Council. It was suggested that more boulders are placed at the entrance & adjacent to the lay-by

11. PROPOSED WEBSITE FORMAT

Hard copies of the website pages were circulated and, apart from some fine tuning, Councillors agreed the format and unanimously agreed a vote of thanks to Anne and Barry of Burtonweb for their hard work in producing so efficiently such an excellent website.

12. CLLR.ROGERS NEW ROLE WITH CALC

A short presentation was delivered by Cllr.Rogers explaining his new part time role for CALC as a Regional Advisor within Cumbria to promote the Quality Parish Scheme.

13. REPORTS

- Cllr.Mason-Hornby reported an obscured footpath sign on Kidnappers Lane.
- Cllr.Alderson reported a complaint about a piece of concrete lying on the footway at the bottom of Vicarage Lane that needs removing by the Highways Department. (CD)
- Cllr.Rogers reported bushes that needed trimming outside 29 St.James Drive (CD)
- Cllr.Isherwood reported that the manhole cover outside Dial House on Main Street has not been attended to by United Utilities, despite him being given three job numbers so far.
- Also he reported work will commence in January 2005 on the Information Centre, after the agreement has been signed by both parties.
- Cllr. Hopwood reported that she had attended the South Lakeland Affordable Housing Task Group on 25 November. Items discussed included the Yorkshire Dales pilot scheme using income from second homes tax to finance affordable housing; a shared equity model scheme to give grants to people to enable them to purchase their own homes, thus releasing rented homes, and a proposal to encourage private landlords to enter a partnership scheme with the councils to rent at affordable rents. Also the need to provide affordable housing to 'keyworkers' in the area.
- Cllr. Hopwood reported on the Quarry Liaison Group meeting. Only one complaint has been received since March and that concerned blasting. This is now taking place on the south face of the quarry near Clawthorpe and is being monitored by both SLDC and Aggregate Industries. The next phase of the Aggregates Levy Sustainability Fund is due to be announced soon. The Group is formulating a bid pending the announcement.
- Cllr. Hopwood reported that she and Cllr. Boddy met the Avebury Taverns Property Manager at the Royal Hotel on 23 November and discussed the purchase of the Recreation Ground as well as the purchase of
